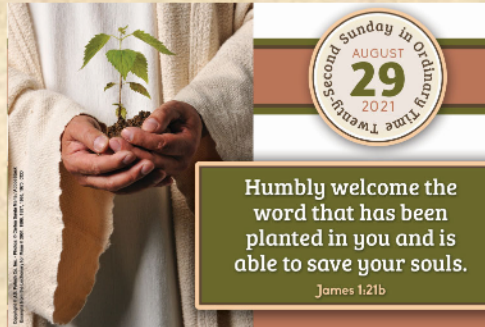

James 1:21b

Imagine for a moment that Jesus has invited you to a dinner party. You are seated at the table, there is good music playing in the background, and you have been served your favorite meal. As soon as you begin to eat, you overhear your neighbors arguing with each other and saying that several people didn't seem to know much about protocol and tradition. Shocked and a little disturbed by what you have just heard, you look over to

where Jesus is and confirm that it is true. Jesus was speaking to apparently unclean people.

Maybe you've had the opportunity to see advertising for you to join a gym and train your body or to learn a new skill and train your mind. Have you seen an offer to train your heart? Maybe when you see the symbol of a heart you immediately associate it with lovers. For Jesus and the Jews, the heart goes far beyond the visible or the romantic idea. The heart is a special place of intimacy and encounter; it is consciousness. God asks Solomon what gift he wants, and Solomon answers: "a wise and understanding heart"

In the Gospel of this weekend, we may think that Jesus intends to insult the Jewish brothers and tell them that they are hypocrites, but today Jesus asks you to listen to him. He tells you directly that "there is nothing outside of you that, when it enters you, can make you impure; it is the things that come out of your heart that make you impure." Appearances, what we show before society, do not say much about us. Keep in mind that what you say about others says more about you than about them.

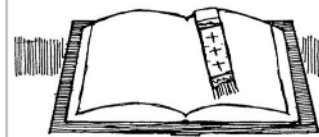

FEAST OF FAITH**What Jesus Did, What Jesus Said**

The oldest account of what happened at the Last Supper comes to us not from the Gospels but from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians: "I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me' " (11:23-24). In our celebrations of the Eucharist, we are obedient to Christ's command to "do this." The priest, acting in the person of Christ, does what Jesus did and says what Jesus said. He takes bread, gives thanks, breaks it, and gives it to the Lord's disciples. He takes wine, gives thanks, shares it with us. We believe that the entire Eucharistic Prayer is consecratory, but we continue to hold these words of Jesus in special reverence. They are called the words of consecration, and the elevations of the host and chalice, the genuflections of the priest, and the optional ringing of a bell and use of incense remind us that we are in the presence of the Lord.

DOERS OF THE WORD

The second reading for today begins a five-week series of selections from James, a letter that is classified among the so-called "catholic" (or universal) epistles because they are addressed to a general audience rather than to one particular community. Today's text offers important advice for Christians of every generation. God is first cited as the author of all gifts, and in particular, reference is made to the gift of baptism by which we have been made the "first fruits" of the new creation.

What follows is advice based on a very Jewish understanding of the "word" as an active force, operative in the world. We are reminded that unless we, too, become "doers" of the word, our claim to faith is empty. Today and in subsequent weeks the author reminds us that it is equally important to do the "works" of love, for example, by caring for the "orphans and widows in their

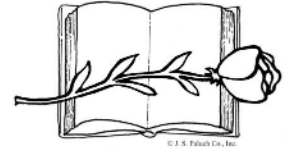

Reflexión del Domingo

Imagínese por un momento que Jesús le ha invitado a una cena. Estás sentado en la mesa, hay buena música tocando en el fondo, y te han servido tu comida favorita. Tan pronto como comienzas a comer, escuchas a tus vecinos discutir entre sí y decir que varias personas no parecían saber mucho sobre el protocolo y la tradición. Conmocionado y un poco perturbado por lo que acabas de escuchar, miras a dónde está Jesús y confirmas que es verdad. Jesús estaba hablando a personas aparentemente impuras.

Tal vez hayas tenido la oportunidad de ver publicidad para que te unas a un gimnasio y entrenen tu cuerpo o para aprender una nueva habilidad y entrenar tu mente. ¿Has visto una oferta para entrenar tu corazón? Tal vez cuando ves el símbolo de un corazón lo asocias inmediatamente con los amantes. Para Jesús y los judíos, el corazón va mucho más allá de lo visible o la idea romántica. El corazón es un lugar especial de intimidad y encuentro; es la conciencia. Dios le pregunta a Salomón qué don quiere, y Salomón responde: "un corazón sabio y comprensivo."

En el Evangelio de este fin de semana, podemos pensar que Jesús tiene la intención de insultar a los hermanos judíos y decirles que son hipócritas, pero hoy Jesús les pide que lo escuchen. Te dice directamente que "no hay nada fuera de ti que, cuando entra en ti, pueda hacerte impuro; son las cosas que salen de tu corazón las que te hacen impuro". Las apariencias que mostramos ante la sociedad, no dicen mucho de nosotros. Ten en cuenta que lo que dices de los demás dice más de ti que de ellos. ¡Paz!

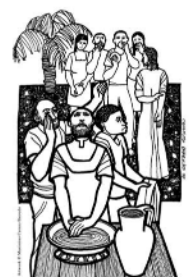

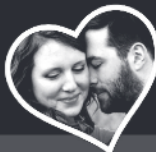
