Easter, undying joy and peace

Joy is at the heart of the Christian message. Our faith teaches us that men and women experience joy when they are in harmony with nature, with the common home, they experience it in the encounter and communion with others, with brothers and, above all, they know joy and happiness when they meet God.

Hence, a patient effort is necessary to learn to enjoy the multiple joys that the Creator puts in our way: the joy of existence and of life; the joy of honest and sanctified love; the calming joy of nature and silence; the sometimes austere joy of painstaking work; the joy and satisfaction of duty accomplished; the transparent joy of purity, of service, of knowing how to share; the demanding joy of sacrifice.

But these joys are insufficient if we do not delve into the announcement of Easter. This joyous song of the Resurrection transfigures the pain and sadness of man and woman, because full joy arises from the victory of the Crucified, from his pierced Heart, from his glorified Body and clarifies the darkness of the souls. Thus, Easter joy is a new presence of the Risen Christ who transfigures human life, causing the disciples to feel carried away by an everlasting joy.

It is good to specify: Christian joy is not the same as an easy contentment or a simple satisfaction of ourselves and others. Christian joy is a sadness overcome, a trial transformed into grace, a death overcome. If we are happy only because everything goes well for us, then we will not be able to be God's witnesses, we will not be able to announce any extraordinary thing. And if we are just poor wretches, we won't be able to teach anything either.

May the Month of Mary

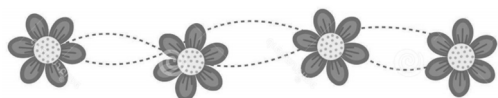
May is traditionally dedicated in a special way to honoring and seeking the intercession of Mary as the Mother of God and Mother of the Church.

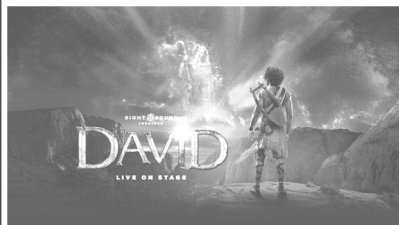

GOD'S OVERFLOWING KINDNESS

The superabundance of God's kindness ties all of today's readings together. Especially when life overwhelms us, the Lord provides all we need, and then some. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter takes the lead when facing the Sanhedrin. We might expect the man who denied Jesus to crumble under the imposing glare of the high priest. Instead, the Holy Spirit helps him testify to his faith in Jesus Christ. What Peter had lacked before, courage and conviction, God provides in abundance. Similarly, today's Gospel shows Jesus providing a surplus of fish for the disciples. They have no luck fishing until the Lord intercedes. Jesus supplies an almost ridiculous number of fish, and he cooks it for them, too. As our reading from Revelation affirms, the overflowing riches of God require constant praise. 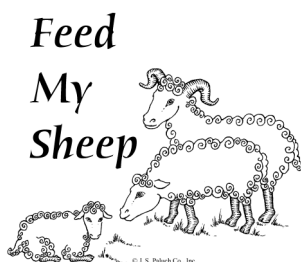

La Pascua, alegría y paz imperecederas

La alegría está en el corazón del mensaje cristiano. De ahí que resulta necesario un esfuerzo paciente para aprender a gustar las múltiples alegrías que el Creador pone en nuestro camino: la alegría de la existencia y de la vida; la alegría del amor honesto y santificado; la alegría tranquilizadora de la naturaleza y del silencio; la alegría a veces austera del trabajo esmerado; la alegría y satisfacción del deber cumplido; la alegría transparente de la pureza, del servicio, del saber compartir; la alegría exigente del sacrificio.

Pero estas alegrías son insuficientes si no ahondamos en el anuncio de la Pascua. Este canto gozoso de la resurrección transfigura el dolor y la tristeza misma del hombre y de la mujer, porque la alegría plena surge de la victoria del Crucificado, de su Corazón traspasado, de su Cuerpo glorificado y esclarece las tinieblas de las almas. Así, la alegría pascual es una nueva presencia de Cristo resucitado que transfigura la vida del hombre haciendo que los discípulos se sientan arrebatados por una alegría imperecedera.

Es bueno precisar: la alegría cristiana no es lo mismo que un contentamiento fácil o que una satisfacción sencilla de nosotros mismos y de los demás. La alegría cristiana es una tristeza superada, una prueba transformada en gracia, una muerte vencida. Si somos felices sólo porque todas las cosas nos salen bien, entonces no podremos ser testigos de Dios, no podremos anunciar ninguna cosa extraordinaria. Y si somos únicamente unos pobres desdichados, tampoco podremos enseñar nada.

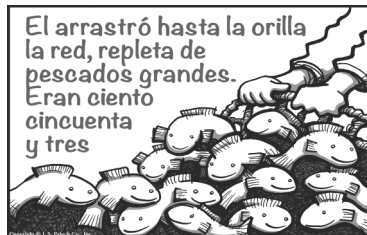
