

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Time and again, Saint Paul insists in his letters that it was the message and not the messenger that inspired the Christian communities throughout the Mediterranean. He himself could not stay in one place forever nor could be in all places at once. Precisely for that reason he kept writing those long letters!

For both His message and the Holy Spirit could remain forever in one place and could be everywhere at once. Once those faith communities were inspired, they became lights that illuminated the power, love, and mercy of Christ for all around the world to see. Let our Christian community do the same.

Last week we heard Jesus teach the beatitudes and declare which people were blessed by God. Linking that passage with today's adds another dimension to our calling. We can enlighten others with the lessons of the beatitudes like the light of a candlestick. Seeking peace instead of conflict inspires others to do the same. Bearing witness to our faith in eternal life with a merciful God comforts those who mourn the loss of a loved one. Working for justice inspires solidarity with those who are also hungry for those ideals. Let us live the beatitudes openly, so that others may appreciate their value and imitate us.

If we are the light of the world as Jesus tells his disciples, it is by reflecting the light of Christ, who also told them that he was the light of the world and those who followed him would have the light of life. When we were baptized we were given a candle lit with the flame of the paschal candle and we were invited to walk always in the light of Christ.

Throughout the course of our lives we must be aware of that flame that burns in our hearts, because it has the light to illuminate before the world the shadows of sin and injustice, the shadows of poverty and evil; all those shadows that Christ came to dispel.

Gospel Meditation: ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

I recently decided to learn to cook. As I sit at the feet of various YouTube cooking masters, I notice how much of cooking is adding ingredients that don't provide any more nourishment, like herbs and other seasonings. But man! They make all the difference because they make the meal delightful to eat and share.

Jesus calls his disciples "salt of the world." No one eats just salt. So, Christians are not meant to replace or do away with the world. They are meant to be agents of preservation and glorification. Notice how often these days the Church seeks to preserve what is threatened: the goodness of marital and family love, the desires of young people for greatness, the value of honest work, healthy economics, and altruistic political engagement, the dignity of the poor and vulnerable. Over and over, we say to a world who wants to throw things out, "It's worth saving! We'll preserve it! We'll show you it's wonderful." If we can't engage the world like that, Jesus says we are the ones who get thrown out, because salt alone is worthless.

Jesus only asks us to do for others what he does for us. He is the "salt" of everything in our lives. Is there something in your life starting to rot a bit? Something tasting bland and boring? Let Jesus salt it and see if you like it better.

It's a surprising little word — if. For such a short word, it holds an abundance of excuses.

Personally, I could buy a new car if I had a dollar for every time I used the word "if" to explain away my own flaws. "If I wasn't so tired. If we had more money. If the kids weren't always on my last nerve. If I had more talent. If life wasn't so hard."

If, if, if.

I don't always feel like being the salt of the earth. Can't someone else season the dish? Sometimes it's more than I want to give, more than I want to do, more than I want to be. Sharing my bread, sheltering the oppressed, clothing the naked, and accompanying my neighbor — doing these things in the literal or figurative sense can be completely exhausting. Mediocrity is so easy. It's so comfortable.

But if. It looms again, that short but powerful word.

"If" can be deep with excuses, but it can also be wide with possibility. If I bring it all to God. If I stop relying on my own abilities. If I prayed more than I talked. If I make my heart firm. If my faith does not rest on human wisdom.

If not me, who? If not now, when?



PREGUNTAS DE LA SEMANA - INVITAR A PARROQUIANOS A REFLEXIONAR Y RESPONDER

Primera Lectura:

El profeta Isaías habló del deseo de Dios de que no solo alimentemos a los hambrientos y cuidemos de los afligidos, sino también que nos deshagamos del lenguaje malicioso y acusatorio. ¿Cuál de estas directivas podrías hacer esta semana?

Segunda Lectura:

Pablo enseña a los corintios a poner su fe en el poder de Dios más que en la sabiduría humana. ¿Cuáles podrían ser algunas buenas maneras de asegurarse de que esto se convierta en un ejercicio espiritual regular?

Evangelio:

Jesús llama a sus seguidores a ser sal de la tierra y luz del mundo. En otras palabras, Jesús está llamando a sus seguidores a tener una influencia positiva en el mundo. ¿De qué manera los creyentes de hoy pueden hacer el bien en el mundo?

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Todos en algún momento de nuestra vida queremos brillar. Por ejemplo: en la escuela deseamos el primer lugar; en los deportes pasa lo mismo, el trofeo es importante para lucir en los medios de comunicación. Ahora, en la modernidad, los youtubers quieren brillar, dar luz y ser los mejores. La liturgia de hoy nos relata cómo Jesús se dirige a todos nosotros para ser sal y luz. “Ustedes son sal de la tierra... ustedes son la luz del mundo” (Mateo 5,13-14). Qué bonito sería ser sal hasta que se haga justicia, y ser luz hasta que triunfe la paz. Se ha olvidado el significado de ser hijos de la luz. Violencia, injusticia, muerte y destrucción es lo que oscurece a la sociedad actual.

Pero, ¿está todo perdido? ¿Cuál sería la esperanza? El Evangelio da una serie de recomendaciones. Algunas de ellas son: compartir el pan y lo que tenemos con el que menos tiene, dar posada al inmigrante, escuchar al triste, al enfermo. Por mencionar algunos puntos. Es decir, no dar la espalda al propio hermano. Queremos ser, como Jesús, sal y luz para el mundo y para todos los que viven cerquita de nosotros. Saber dar sabor a la vida implica darse, comprometerse, salir de la zona de confort, dar un paso siempre adelante, nunca para atrás, como se dice, ni para tomar vuelo. El reto es ser sazonador y lámpara de Dios, hablando por los sin voz. Solo así, Jesús podrá decirnos: “Ustedes son la sal y luz del mundo”. ©LPI

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
