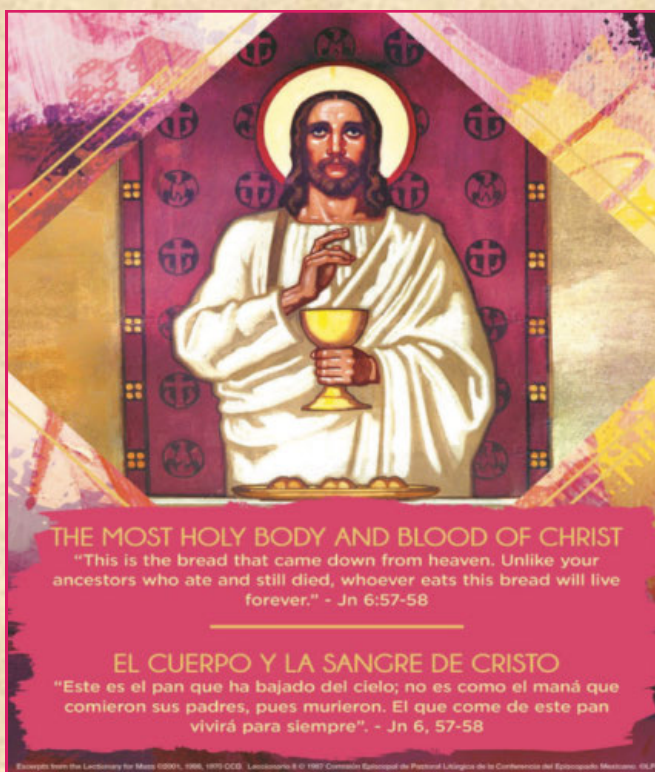

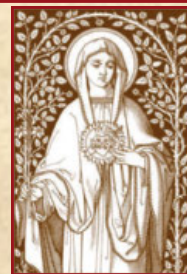

Solemnity of Corpus Christi

Dear Brothers in the Lord, Life, Love and Dreams:
Greetings and Blessings to all in this new time of sharing and joy. We start a new month well loaded with many celebrations.

This weekend (June 10-11, 2023) the Universal Church invites us to live with deep faith and devotion one of the most beautiful and great liturgical celebrations that leads us to the 'heart' of our deep relationship with the Lord Jesus: the Solemnity of Corpus Christi.

A celebration in which we remember in a very special way how the Lord Jesus at the Last Supper with his disciples gives all his love, his Body and his Blood through the bread and wine through which he leaves us the memorial of his infinite, loving and generous sacrifice of love.

Since then the Church and each of its members has walked, walks and will walk with that "viaticum" necessary to continue living and proclaiming the Kingdom of God without respite or rest, untiring and in the love of the Lord.

The Lord Jesus gives himself totally in the Eucharist for us; in the words of Pope Francis, he teaches and reminds us: "Jesus has shed his blood as a price and as a sacred bath that washes us, so that we may be purified from all sins: to avoid dissolving ourselves, to look at it, to satisfy ourselves of its source, to be preserved from the risk of corruption. And then we will experience the grace of a transformation: we will always remain poor sinners, but the Blood of Christ will deliver us from our sins and restore our dignity."

But that surrender does not end at the Sacrifice of the Lord Jesus on the altar. It is necessary that this sacrifice of love, of which I am a participant, extends and reaches others, that this "breaking" of the Lord Jesus does not remain only in me, but transcends, reaches others, falls in love with others.

Along with the above, and as part of this great Solemnity we will have this year FOR THE SECOND TIME our procession with the Blessed Sacrament from IHM (Immaculate Heart of Mary) after the Holy Mass of 12 noon. In this regard, once again, in the words of our Holy Father, Francis invites us to live and celebrate this Solemnity publicly: "Today, the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we have the joy not only of celebrating this mystery, but also of praising and singing it through the streets of our city. That the procession that we will carry out at the end of the Mass may express our recognition for the whole path that God has made us travel through the desert of our miseries, to make us leave the servile condition, nourishing us of His Love through the Sacrament of His Body and Blood."

Let us all unite in one faith, one ecclesial joy with great happiness, on this Solemnity of Corpus Christi 2023, and may this celebration permeate, infuse and inspire in our hearts the fire of Love and continue to accompany us in our following of the Lord Jesus with joy, hope and joy.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "**Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?**" For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "**we, though many, are one body.**" Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic. It's our participation of love in the one we love.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Real Presence

Question:

How do you explain "Real Presence" to children?

Answer:

The first Communion class is filled with excitement to the point of bursting! They are just awestruck by every new thing they learn about Jesus. Their enthusiasm is contagious as they rattle off the names of the things in church, the vessels and vestments used at Mass, and the names of their pastors and priests. Of course, they know Christ can do anything because he's God. He comes to us in holy Communion because he loves us so much that he wants to be with us. And he comes to us in the form of bread and wine. We really receive him in the Eucharist.

Sometimes it is easier to explain this to children than to adults. Their faith and trust in Jesus is not limited by the questions and doubts that often come with the question of how he does it. Rather, they focus on the question "why," and the answer is something they can easily grasp: love. Christ wants to be with us because he loves us. Nothing is purer in truth or in faith. Not even the theological explanation of transubstantiation, or philosophical reasoning or symbolic references, come close. Christ takes on the form of bread and wine to be simple and approachable, so that no one is afraid or turned away. His love for us is complete and total. We try to love him the same way in return. For a child, it is simple. For us adults, we keep trying. "Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3). -@LPI

Corpus Christi

What we celebrate

Corpus Christi is a feast day with the sole purpose of focusing on the Holy Eucharist.



When we celebrate

Officially the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. However, it's most often celebrated on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday.

Ways we celebrate

- A procession of the Eucharist around your parish.
- Eucharistic Adoration after Mass.
- Praying a traditional Catholic prayer called "Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament" at the end of Mass and singing songs about the Eucharist.
- If the Feast of Corpus Christi is a public holiday where you live, you may see a Eucharist procession (sometimes by candlelight) happening in the streets.

History

Saint Juliana of Liege (1193-1258), who had a great reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, began the cause for the feast day of Corpus Christi. This day would be apart from Holy Thursday when the Church focuses on not only the Eucharist but the washing of the feet, ordained priesthood, and Jesus in agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. Saint Juliana was motivated by a recurring vision of the Church as a full moon with one dark spot, which she interpreted as the absence of a specific reverence to the Holy Eucharist. In her later years, she gained the support of Jacques Pantaléon, at the time Archdeacon of Liège, and other Church leaders. Pantaléon was later elected Pope Urban IV and went on to establish the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Spend some time in prayer today asking for a greater ability to see the face of Christ in others. (If you're Catholic, spend that prayer time in front of the Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist). Then say a quick prayer for five random people that you pass throughout your day.

Queridos Hermanos en el Señor la Vida, el Amor y los Sueños:

Saludos y Bendiciones para todos en este nuevo tiempo de compartir y alegría. Empezamos un nuevo mes y bien cargado de muchas celebraciones.

Mis queridos hermanos este fin de semana (junio 10-11, 2023) la Iglesia Universal nos invita a vivir con profunda Fe y devoción una de las más bellas y grandes celebraciones litúrgicas que nos lleva al 'corazón' de nuestra profunda relación con el Señor Jesús: **La Solemnidad del Corpus Christi**.

Una celebración en la que recordamos de manera muy especial como el Señor Jesús en la Última Cena con sus discípulos dona todo su amor, su Cuerpo y su Sangre mediante el pan y el vino a través del cual nos deja el memorial de su sacrificio infinito, amoroso y generoso de amor.

Unamos todos en una sola fe, una sola alegría eclesial con gran júbilo, en esta Solemnidad del Corpus Christi 2023, y que esta celebración permee, infunda e inspire en nuestros corazones el fuego del Amor y nos siga acompañando en nuestro seguimiento del Señor Jesús con alegría, esperanza y regocijo.
