Nuestra opción por los jóvenes según el modelo de San Juan Bosco



Don Bosco, también conocido como San Juan Bosco, fue un sacerdote y educador católico italiano que dedicó su vida al bienestar y la educación de los jóvenes, en particular los de entornos pobres y desfavorecidos. Fundó la Orden Salesiana, también

conocida como los Salesianos de Don Bosco, que es una congregación religiosa enfocada en brindar educación, formación profesional y apoyo social a los jóvenes.

El Párroco y su Consejo Pastoral se plantearon atender a los jóvenes de nuestra parroquia.

La especialización que requiere la atención a los adolescentes y las diversas aristas que componen un programa juvenil han sido analizadas y se ha decidido trabajar con un número pequeño de jóvenes que muestran compromiso con su fe y con su comunidad. Ellos forman parte de diversos ministerios parroquiales como monaguillos, ujieres, coro y catequesis; allí han demostrado su liderazgo y constancia. Ellos serán la base y el corazón de los líderes que motiven a otros chicos a abrazar lo místico y lo práctico de nuestra iglesia católica.

Este grupo de nueve chicas y chicos de entre 15 y 18 años han sido invitados a trabajar con el propósito de ser parte de una peregrinación nacional a realizarse en el mes de Noviembre, a Indianápolis.

Anualmente la Federación Nacional de Ministerios Juveniles Católicos (NFCYM siglas en inglés), la misma que trabaja como parte de la Conferencia de los Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos, realiza un encuentro de líderes juveniles en la que se enfatiza la integración de los jóvenes católicos alrededor de los sacramentos de la Confesión y Eucaristía. Y que por otro lado tiene los componentes de música, invitados a hablar de temas de actualidad y la vivencia comunitaria. Evento que lo vienen realizando por los últimos 15 años.

Los jóvenes peregrinos de St Joseph of the Palisades están guiados por los responsables adultos de los diferentes ministerios parroquiales, a la cabeza de un coordinador; es decir que estos primeros pasos que estamos realizando con toda seguridad para los participantes y sus familias, le garantizan a la parroquia la promoción de sus líderes juveniles nacidos de su interior y conocedores de la comunidad.

En los próximos días estaremos lanzando una gran campaña para apoyar esta iniciativa, también están planeadas actividades a las que le pedimos su participación activa.

Don Bosco sentía una pasión inmensa por salvar a los jóvenes, sobresalía la fe y esperanza que tenía en ellos, sin importar su condición o situación los acogía con cariño, decía: "No hay jóvenes malos, hay jóvenes que no saben que pueden ser buenos y alguien tiene que decírselos". Seguramente como hoy la tarea no fue fácil. La vida cristiana siempre nos llama a la esperanza y don Bosco nos invita a construir esa esperanza con una riqueza añadida, Fe en la gente, salgamos de nuestras comodidades y sigamos su ejemplo; busquemos y acompañemos a nuestros niños y jóvenes con caridad y disciplina, recemos por ellos para que Jesús obre en sus corazones.

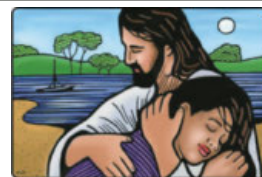

This is an opportunity for you to renew, strengthen, and deepen your faith. Regardless of how we get to Church, or what draws us closer to God, the fact is we are there. Do what you need to do to get right with God and the Church. Go to confession, begin good family religious practices, and be involved in the ministries your parish offers. Our choice for young people according to the model of St. John Bosco



Don Bosco, also known as St. John Bosco, was an Italian Catholic priest and educator who dedicated his life to the welfare and education of young people, particularly those from poor and disadvantaged backgrounds. He founded the

Salesian Order, also known as the Salesians of Don Bosco, which is a religious congregation focused on providing education, vocational training and social support to young people.

The Pastor and his Pastoral Council have decided to tend to the young people of our parish. The specialization required to care for adolescents and the various aspects that make up a youth program have been analyzed and it has been decided to work with a small number of young people who show commitment to their faith and their community. They are part of various parish ministries such as altar servers, ushers, choir and catechesis; there they have demonstrated their leadership and perseverance. They will be the foundation and heart of leaders who will motivate other kids to embrace the mystical and the practical of our Catholic Church.

This group of nine girls and boys between the ages of 15 and 18 have been invited to work with the purpose of being part of a national pilgrimage to Indianapolis in the month of November. Annually the National Federation of Catholic Youth Ministries (NFCYM), the same one that works as part of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, holds a meeting for youth leaders in which it emphasizes the integration of young Catholics around the sacraments of Confession and Eucharist. There are components of music, speakers to talk about current issues and community experience. It's an event they have been doing for the last 15 years.

The young pilgrims of St Joseph of the Palisades are guided by adult leaders of the different parish ministries, and they in turn are headed by a coordinator; that is to say that these first steps that we are carrying out with all security for the participants and their families, guarantee the parish the promotion of its youth leaders born from within and knowledgeable about the community.

In the next few days we will be launching a big campaign to support this initiative. There are also planned activities to which we ask your active participation.

Don Bosco felt an immense passion to save young people. The faith and hope he had in them stood out. Regardless of their condition or situation he welcomed them with affection. He said: "There are no bad young people, there are young people who do not know that they can be good and someone has to tell them". Surely, as today, the task was not easy. Christian life always calls us to hope and Don Bosco invites us to build that hope with an added richness, faith in people, leaving our comforts to follow their example. Let us seek out and accompany our children and young people with charity and discipline. Let us pray for them so that Jesus may work in their hearts.

Parish Time Line

1877: John Giraud succeeds Fr. Kirwin. Also serves as chaplain to the Shadyside Chapel, North Bergen. Eventually receives calling to become a Jesuit priest.

1880-1890: Fr. Francis O'Neill becomes pastor. A new frame school with residence for the Franciscan Sisters of Peekskill, NY is built.

1891: Rev. Joseph Hill becomes pastor.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Do you ever feel restless? I certainly do. Daily tasks and challenges, but also the more basic demand of simply existing — sooner or later, this can all feel crushing and tire us out.

Which is why Jesus' words are such stunningly good news: "Come to me all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

How vastly weird that this man speaks as though he is capable of giving us the deep repose we desire. Is his claim the height of absurd grandiosity? No, because next he immediately proclaims that he is "meek and humble of heart." We here touch a mystery: Jesus is capable of giving us rest because he is the one who forever reposes in the heart of God the Father. He is "yoked" to the Father in his divinity. But he is humbly "yoked" to us, sharing in our humanity.

The good news, my fellow tired-out friends: we don't have to despair in our burdens and exhaustion, no matter how heavy they feel. This week, join me in opening our hearts to hear him say to us, "Come! I will give you rest." We come to him in the Church, Eucharist, the Scriptures, prayer, in the poor. There he will give us rest.
