# LA NECESIDAD DE ORAR

## DOMINGO 28 DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Queridos Hermanos en el Señor la Vida y el Amor, saludos y bendiciones. Que alegría poder compartir una vez más una pequeña reflexión para nuestro crecimiento espiritual y personal.

Estamos en el mes de Octubre y avanzamos este hermoso y fresco (ya más frío) tiempo de otoño, con nuestras familias y comunidades en medio de celebraciones, momentos especiales y tantas alegrías y retos que nos presenta el Señor.

Octubre es el mes del Santo Rosario, Mes de las Misiones y en nuestra iglesia local en especial celebramos la Herencia Hispana o celebración de la Hispanidad. En particular, nuestro Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco nos ha pedido rezar como intención específica durante este mes *"para que la Iglesia, fiel al Evangelio y valiente en su anuncio, viva cada vez más la sinodalidad y sea un lugar de solidaridad, fraternidad y acogida"*. Así que vamos a unir nuestros corazones, deseos e intenciones a las del Santo Padre y oremos por nuestra Iglesia, por tantos conflictos en todo el mundo y especialmente por esa guerra en Medio Oriente entre Israel y Hamás; mis hermanos necesitamos orar, orar incansablemente.

Este domingo 28 del Tiempo Ordinario, por ejemplo, nos trae una recomendación y enseñanza concreta sobre la necesidad e importancia de prepararnos y aceptar la invitación del Señor, como ese Rey del Evangelio, que invita a un gran banquete. Nosotros también estamos cada Domingo, especialmente invitados al Gran Banquete de la Eucaristía.

Algunas veces nos desanimamos, nos desconcertamos porque pareciera que en medio de tantas dificultades, imitaciones o carencias Dios no nos escucha o no nos acompaña; pero no es así, el Señor constantemente nos invita a su seguimiento.

Al respecto del evangelio en una de sus reflexiones el Santo Padre Francisco nos dice: *"Jesús iba a almorzar con los publicanos, que eran los pecadores públicos, eran los malos. Dios no tiene miedo de nuestra alma herida por tantas maldades, porque nos ama, nos invita. Y la Iglesia está llamada a ir a las encrucijadas de hoy, es decir, a las periferias geográficas y existenciales de la humanidad, esos lugares marginales, esas situaciones en las que se encuentran acampados y viven fragmentos de humanidad sin esperanza. Se trata de no apoltronarse en las formas cómodas y habituales de evangelización y testimonio de la caridad, y de abrir las puertas de nuestro corazón y de nuestras comunidades a todos, porque el Evangelio no está reservado a unos pocos elegidos. (...) Sin embargo, el Señor pone una condición: llevar el traje de boda. Y volvemos a la parábola. (...) El traje de boda -ese chal- simboliza la misericordia que Dios nos da gratuitamente, es decir, la gracia. Sin la gracia no se puede dar un paso adelante en la vida cristiana. Todo es gracia."*

Vamos pues mis queridos hermanos a reflexionar este Domingo y esta semana preparamos espiritual y personalmente a tantas fiestas y bendiciones que el Señor nos invita, especialmente a Vivir la Fiesta de la Eucaristía.

Que esta semana en nuestros momentos de reflexión y en lo profundo de nuestro corazón sigamos respondiendo a nuestro seguimiento del Señor.

Que este bello y fresco tiempo de otoño, sea una oportunidad para "abrir" nuestros corazones al fuego de su Espíritu y nos inspire a caminar con nuestra Iglesia, siempre en misión, con una maravillosa esperanza, alegría y compasión.

# THE NECESSITY TO PRAY

## 28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Brothers in the Lord, Life and Love, greetings and blessings. What a joy to be able to share once again a small reflection for our spiritual and personal growth.

We are in the month of October and moving forward through this beautiful and cool (already colder) autumn season, with our families and communities in the midst of celebrations, special moments and so many joys and challenges that the Lord presents us.

October is the month of the Holy Rosary, Month of the Missions and in our local church in particular we celebrate Hispanic Heritage. In particular, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has asked us to pray as a specific intention during this month *"so that the Church, faithful to the Gospel and courageous in her proclamation, may live synodality more and more and be a place of solidarity, fraternity and welcome."* So let us unite our hearts, desires and intentions to those of the Holy Father and pray for our Church, for so many conflicts around the world and especially for the war in the Middle East between Israel and Hamas; My brothers need to pray, pray tirelessly.

This 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time, for example, brings us a concrete recommendation and teaching on the need and importance of preparing ourselves and accepting the invitation of the Lord, like that King of the Gospel, who invites us to a great banquet. We too are especially invited to the Great Banquet of the Eucharist every Sunday.

Sometimes we become discouraged and bewildered because it seems that in the midst of so many difficulties, imitations or shortcomings God does not listen or does not accompany us; but it is not so, the Lord constantly invites us to follow Him.

Regarding the Gospel in one of his reflections, the Holy Father Francis tells us: *"Jesus was going to have lunch with the tax collectors, who were the public sinners, they were the bad ones. God is not afraid of our soul wounded by so many evils, because he loves us, he invites us. And the Church is called to go to the crossroads of today, that is, to the geographical and existential peripheries of humanity, those marginal places, those situations in which they are encamped and live fragments of humanity without hope. It is a question of not settling on the comfortable and habitual forms of evangelization and witness to charity, and of opening the doors of our hearts and of our communities to all, because the Gospel is not reserved for a select few. (...) However, the Lord puts one condition: wear the wedding dress. And we return to the parable. (...) The wedding dress – that shawl – symbolizes the mercy that God gives us freely, that is, grace. Without grace you cannot take a step forward in Christian life. Everything is grace."*

Let us therefore reflect on this Sunday and this week by preparing ourselves spiritually and personally for so many feasts and blessings that the Lord invites us, especially to live the Feast of the Eucharist.

May this week during our moments of reflection and deep in our hearts continue to respond to our following of the Lord.

May this beautiful and fresh autumn season be an opportunity to "burn" our hearts with the fire of his Spirit and inspire us to walk with our Church, always with a mission, with wonderful hope, joy and compassion.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

#### Is it Right to Sue?

#### Question:

Is it right to sue someone? Isn't it a way of getting revenge?

#### Answer:

Revenge is inflicting harm for harm's sake, the idea of an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, and then some. There is often a fine line between justice and mercy, between compensation and forgiveness. Unfortunately, things can happen to us that cause harm, suffering, and damage, regardless of people's intentions. When someone is hurt, especially in such a way that special care or treatment is required, the cost of that care needs to be paid.

In a perfect world, those with special needs, handicaps, or disabilities would find the help and care they need, including those who are injured or hurt. But justice is not always forthcoming, and people are not always fair. So, using the legal system to right a wrong is sometimes the only option.

In some cases, it is the only way that people can get the help they need and deserve. However, frivolous lawsuits, or 'fishing for money' is not only unfair, but immoral as well. The law is there to protect people and making use of it when necessary is a good thing. ©LPI
