## 30 Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario

## **30th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Matthew 22, 34-40



The Church is a community of men and women united in love. But in the midst of a troubled world that demands so much, many times it causes it to lose its tranquility and values intrinsically innate to human nature; that is why we must form a personality which is

synonymous with harmony, fraternity and unity, which will lead them to form a community committed to love that will lead them to build a Church where love and brotherly mercy are their hallmarks following the example of its founder, Jesus of Nazareth.

The Liturgy of the Word on this thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time reminds us, through the reading of the Book of Exodus, about the mercy and love that God has for his people. Love and mercy that must be practiced by not making the stranger suffer or feel oppressed, nor exploiting widows or orphans, since they, the people of Israel, were also foreigners in Egypt.

The sacred writer exhorts us to practice justice with the poor and needy, in other words, be compassionate and merciful because God is always a loving and just Father with the needy. Christian followers of Jesus must put into practice the commandment to love God and neighbor as we love ourselves.

Love is the noblest passion that moves the human being to perform great actions in pursuit of the integral and selfless realization of the human being. We know that love transforms, gives security, confidence and maturity in human relationships; love sows balance and if it is authentic, it leads to the development and structuring of the human being.

This Sunday's Gospel is very telling when Jesus being questioned about what was the greatest commandment of the law, answered: "Love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind." This is the greatest and the first of the commandments. And the second is similar to this one: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Those of us baptized in Christ are committed to living in Him and helping Him build a world where love, mercy, justice and forgiveness are the hallmarks of His resurrection in families and in society, which lead us to build a new world with healthy and holy horizons for all human Rev. José Luis Soto beings.
