## Aniversario del Grupo Paz y Bien



### *Segundo Domingo de Adviento*

**Marcos 1, 1-8**

La iglesia ha comenzado el Domingo pasado el tiempo de Adviento. El tiempo litúrgico del Ciclo B. En este tiempo la iglesia nos está invitando a levantar la mirada hacia Dios con confianza para revisar nuestras vidas y prepararnos espiritualmente para la venida del Mesías, aun en medio de un mundo donde rápidamente crecen los antivalores humanos y trascendentes que nos apartan de Dios y de los seres humanos. Antivalores que llevan muchas veces a vivir sumergidos en la oscuridad del orgullo, el egoísmo y la comodidad que no nos dejan salir de sí mismos. A esto se unen factores de miedos y angustias ante las incertidumbres tales como las guerras, economías decadentes, falta de trabajo, división de las familias que llevan a situaciones degradantes que rompen con los criterios sanos de convivencia. Pero en medio de estas situaciones no se puede perder la confianza que siempre se puede construir un mundo mejor. Por eso la Iglesia en este tiempo de Adviento quiere iluminar el mundo con un mensaje de esperanza que revitalice al ser humano y le impulse a formar un mundo nuevo en el que podamos vivir todos como hermanos.

En la liturgia de la palabra el profeta Isaías quiere iluminar al Pueblo de Israel de ese entonces a cambiar de su vida de pecado y preparar el camino de señor en el desierto, construyendo en el paramo una calzada para Dios. Sugiere el Profeta que enderecen lo torcido y lo escabroso se allane. Que todo valle se eleve, que todo monte y colina se rebajen para la gloria del Señor.

En la segunda lectura de la segunda carta de San Pedro sugiere a la comunidad de estar preparados para la venida del Señor quien promote una tierra nueva y un cielo nuevo donde habite la justicia por tanto poner todo el imperio para que el Señor los halle en paz, sin mancha ni reproche.

El evangelio de San Marcos nos exhorta a prepararnos para el encuentro con Cristo naciente. Aparece así Juan el Bautista elegido para ser el portador de la Buena Noticia exigiendo un bautismo de arrepentimiento, es decir, una metanoia, palabra griega utilizada por el evangelista que significa cambio interior, cambio del corazón. Es decir, dejar los viejos hábitos de egoísmo, orgullo, sensualidad, lo cual implica un cambio radical que nos una a Dios y a los hermanos.

Juan el bautista es un ejemplo, un testigo en su modo de vivir con simplicidad, sin propaganda, ejemplo de pobreza y humildad. En su modo de alimentarse y vestir refleja el contenido de su corazón y de la conciencia de su misión. En su manera de anunciar el mensaje muestra la pureza de su corazón, su honradez, su transparencia: “Detrás de mí viene el que puede más que yo que no soy digno de desatarle la correa de sus dandalias”.

A ejemplo del Bautista el evangelio nos invita a un cambio de vida que nos lleve a prepararnos con humildad a la venida del Niño Jesús. Que Él pueda nacer místicamente en nuestros corazones bien preparados al celebrar la Navidad. Que la recepción de una buena confesión y participación en la Eucaristía nos prepare a vivir más cerca del Señor modelando nuestras actitudes con Dios padre, nuestras familias y nuestros hermanos.

## Second Sunday of Advent

Mark 1, 1-8

Advent began last Sunday; the Liturgical Time of Cycle B. At this time the Church is inviting us to look up to God with confidence to review our lives and prepare us spiritually for the coming of the Messiah, even in the midst of a world where human and transcendent anti-values grow rapidly that turn us away from God and from other people. Anti-values that often lead to living immersed in the darkness of pride, selfishness and comfort that do not allow us to come out of our shells. To this are added factors of fears and anguish before uncertainties such as wars, decadent economies, lack of work, division of families that lead to degrading situations that break with healthy criteria of coexistence. But in the midst of these situations you cannot lose the confidence that you can always build a better world. That is why the Church in this season of Advent wants to illuminate the world with a message of hope that revitalizes people and encourage them to form a new world in which we can all live as brothers and sisters.

To this are added factors of fears and anguish before uncertainties such as wars, decadent economies, lack of work, division of families that lead to degrading situations that break with healthy criteria of coexistence. But in the midst of these situations you cannot lose the confidence that you can always build a better world. That is why the Church in this season of Advent wants to illuminate the world with a message of hope that revitalizes people and encourage them to form a new world in which we can all live as brothers and sisters.

In the Liturgy of the Word, the prophet Isaiah wants to enlighten the People of Israel at that time to change their life of sin and prepare the way of Lord in the desert, building in the wasteland a road for God. The Prophet suggests that the crooked be straightened out and the rugged be smoothed out. Let every valley be lifted up, let every mountain and hill be lowered to the glory of the Lord.

In the second reading of the Second Letter of St. Peter, he suggests that the community be prepared for the coming of the Lord who will promote a new earth and a new heaven where justice dwells, and therefore put all their efforts so that the Lord may find them in peace, without blemish or reproach.

The Gospel of St. Mark exhorts us to prepare ourselves for the encounter with the rising Christ. Thus John the Baptist appears chosen to be the bearer of the Good News demanding a baptism of repentance, that is, a metanoia, a Greek word used by the evangelist that means interior change, change of heart. That is, to abandon the old habits of selfishness, pride, sensuality, which implies a radical change that unites us to God and to our brothers and sisters.

John the Baptist is an example, a witness in his way of living simply, without propaganda, an example of poverty and humility. The way he eats and dresses reflects the content of his heart and the awareness of his mission. In the way he proclaims the message, he shows the purity of his heart, his honesty, his transparency: "Behind me comes the one who can do more than I can, the one who I am not worthy to untie the strap of his sandals."

Following the example of the Baptist, the Gospel invites us to a change of life that leads us to prepare ourselves with humility for the coming of the Child Jesus. May He be mystically born in our well-prepared hearts as we celebrate Christmas. May the reception of a good confession and participation in the Eucharist prepare us to live closer to the Lord by shaping our attitudes towards God the Father, our families and our brothers and sisters.

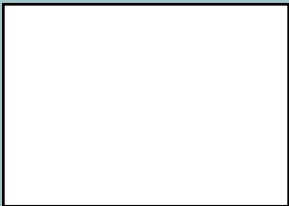
