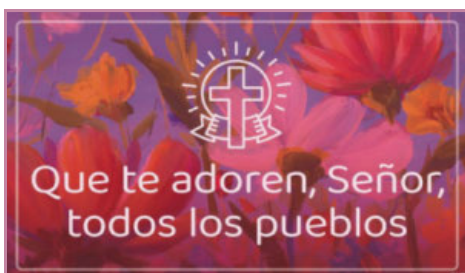

SOLEMNIDAD DE LA EPIFANIA DEL SEÑOR

"Hemos visto salir su estrella y venimos a adorarlo."

Queridos Hermanos en el Señor la Vida, el Amor y, la Alegría. Reciban un cariñoso saludo y muchas bendiciones en este nuevo año que ya empezó, y que el Señor nos regala con su inmensa bondad y misericordia para alegrarnos con la Iglesia, la familia, los amigos y toda la creación.

Vamos empezando un nuevo año civil y en medio del Jolgorio de este tiempo, empezaremos un nuevo mes que nos regala nuevos retos, desafíos y sueños por vivir.

Recordemos hermanos que al iniciar este nuevo año debemos empezar con la mejor actitud, proyectarnos y "hacer o escribir" nuestros *Propósitos para el Año Nuevo*.

Que, centrándonos más en lo bonito y positivo del año anterior, empecemos con nuevos propósitos, más anhelos, metas a largo mediano y corto plazo que nos ayudaran a darla más sentido a nuestra vida. Los Propósitos son una manera de decirle a Dios: "Señor no sé qué será de este nuevo año, pero lo pongo en tus manos y estas son mis metas, deseos o sueños a realizar". Que empecemos el año con disponibilidad, actitud positiva y la alegría del señor en nuestras vidas.



Y de manera muy festiva al iniciar este nuevo año tenemos la Solemnidad de la Epifanía del Señor o Día de los Reyes.

En este día recordamos de muy especialmente aquel momento en el que los Reyes (Gaspar, Baltazar y Melchor) visitan al niño a María y José, y le presentan sus ofrendas al Rey recién nacido adorándolo.

En este punto de la reflexión sobre la Solemnidad de la Epifanía, el Papa Francisco, en con sus palabras nos enseña y dice: *"Al final de un largo viaje y de una fatigosa búsqueda, los Magos entraron en la casa, «encontraron al niño con María, su madre, y cayendo de rodillas lo adoraron» (Mt 2,11). Este es el punto decisivo. Nuestras inquietudes, nuestras preguntas, los caminos espirituales y las prácticas de la fe deben converger en la adoración del Señor. Allí encuentran la fuente esencial de la que todo nace, porque es el Señor quien suscita en nosotros el sentir, el actuar y el obrar. Todo nace y todo culmina allí, porque el final de cada cosa no es alcanzar una meta personal y recibir gloria para nosotros mismos, sino encontrar a Dios y dejarnos abrazar por su amor, que es lo que da fundamento a nuestra esperanza, nos libra del mal, nos abre al amor a los demás y nos hace personas capaces de construir un mundo más justo y fraterno. De nada sirve activarnos pastoralmente si no ponemos a Jesús en el centro y lo adoramos. El asombro de la adoración. Allí aprendemos a estar delante de Dios no tanto para pedir o para hacer algo, sino sólo para permanecer en silencio y abandonarnos a su amor, para dejarnos aferrar y regenerar por su misericordia. Nosotros muchas veces rezamos, pedimos cosas, reflexionamos, pero por lo general nos falta la oración de adoración. Hemos perdido el sentido de adorar, porque hemos perdido la inquietud de las preguntas y la valentía de avanzar en los riesgos del camino. Hoy el Señor nos invita a hacer como los Magos. Como los Magos, postrémonos, rindámonos ante Dios en el asombro de la adoración. Adoremos a Dios y no a nuestro yo; adoremos a Dios y no a los falsos ídolos que nos seducen con la fascinación del prestigio y del poder, con la fascinación de las falsas noticias; adoremos a Dios para no inclinarnos ante las cosas que pasan ni ante las lógicas seductoras y vacías del mal"*.

Acerquémonos pues hermanos en esta Solemnidad de la Epifanía a nuestro Señor y brindémosle homenaje y nuestra ofrenda.

Vamos a comprometernos este nuevo año a poner nuestra mejor actitud, alegrar nuestro corazón, y toda nuestra persona con bonitos y positivos deseos, viviendo la gran bendición y "novedad" del año nuevo.

De la mano de María, nuestra Madre y Madre de Dios, que también acompañó a su hijo Jesús y a San José; vamos a poner cada uno de nuestras peticiones, anhelos y deseos, para que nuestra Madre Santísima, interceda por nosotros y nos cubra con su manto.

Solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord

"We have seen his star rise and we have come to worship him."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord, Life, Love and Joy:

Please receive an affectionate greeting and many blessings in this new year, and may the Lord give us his immense goodness and mercy to rejoice with the Church, family, friends and all creation.

We are starting a new calendar year and in the midst of the revelry of this time, we will start a new month that will give us new challenges and dreams to live.

Let us remember, brothers and sisters, that we must start this new year with the best attitude, planning new projects and "making or writing" our New Year's Resolutions.



Hence, focusing on the beauty and positivity of the previous year, we should start with new resolutions; more longings, long-term and short-term goals that will help us make more sense of our lives. The Resolutions are a way to say to God: "Lord I do not know what will be of this new year, but I put my goals, desires and dreams in your hands that I want realized." May we begin the year with a better disposition, positive attitude and the joy of the Lord in our lives.

And, in a very festive way we begin this new year with the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, also known as Three Kings Day.

On this day we especially remember that moment in which the Kings (Gaspar, Baltazar and Melchior) visited the child, Mary and Joseph, and presented their offerings to the newborn King, while worshipping him.

In the reflection on the Solemnity of the Epiphany, Pope Francis in his words teaches us and says: *"At the end of a long journey and tiring search, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage (Mt 2.11).* This is the turning point. Our concerns, our questions, the spiritual ways and practices of faith must converge on the worship of the Lord. There we will find the essential source from which everything is born, because it is the Lord who awakens in us feelings, actions and efforts. Everything begins and culminates there, because at the end it is not to reach a personal goal and receive glory for ourselves, but to find God and allow ourselves to be embraced by His love, which is what gives foundation to our hope, frees us from evil, opens us to love others and makes us people capable of building a more just and fraternal world. There is no point in becoming pastorally active if we do not put Jesus at the center and adore him. This is the wonder of worship. Today the Lord invites us to do like the Magi: let us bow down and surrender to God in awe of worship. Let us worship God and not ourself; let us worship God and not false idols that seduce us with the fascination of prestige and power, with the fascination of false news; let us worship God so that we do not bow to the things that happen or to the seductive and empty logic of evil."

Let us therefore approach our brothers and sisters on this Solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord and give Him homage and our offering.

From the hand of Mary, our Mother and Mother of God, who also accompanied her son, Jesus, and Saint Joseph; let us offer our petitions, longings and desires, so that our Blessed Mother may intercede for us and cover us with her mantle.

Blessings and let us joyfully put forth our best attitude.

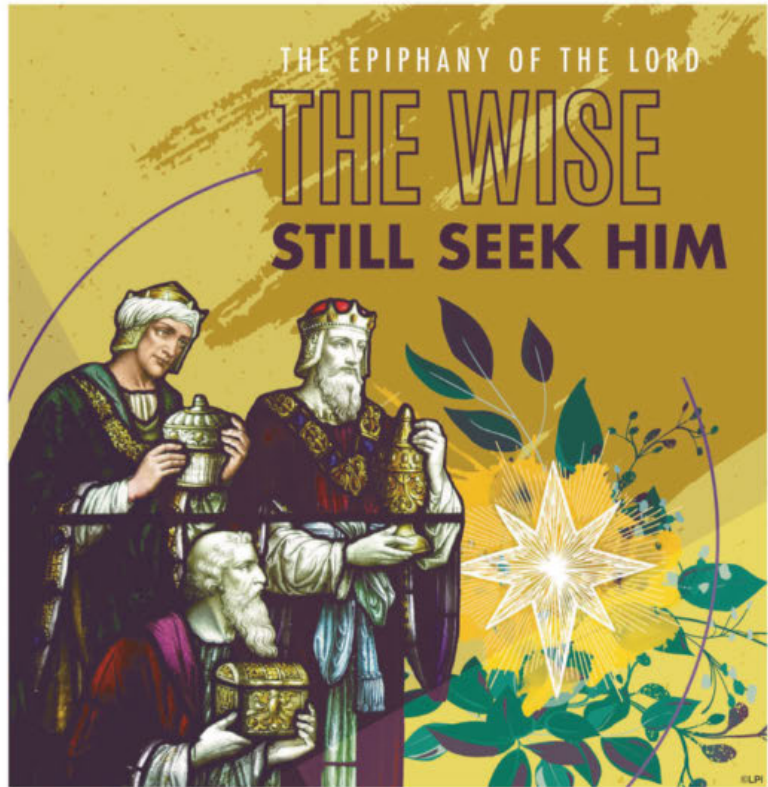
Gospel Reading

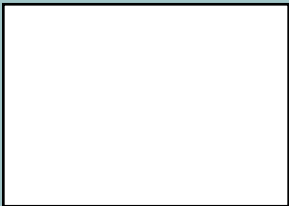
