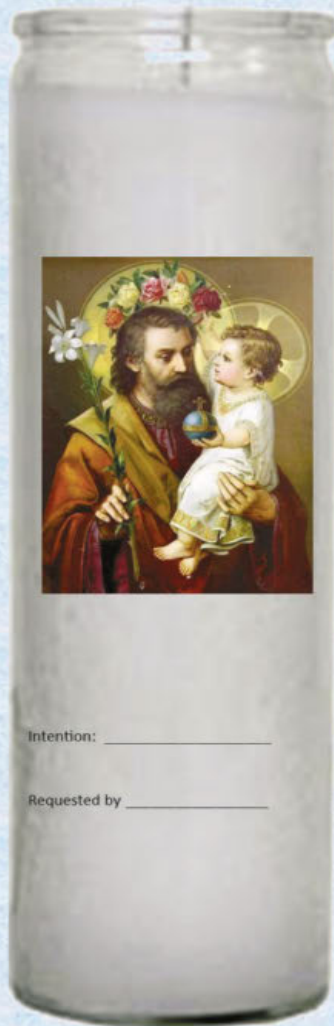

## Tercer Domingo de Cuaresma

## Third Sunday of Lent

On this third Sunday of Lent, as I consider the First Rite of Scrutiny of the Catechumens, that is, the candidates who are preparing for Christian initiation at the Easter Vigil and the celebration of my 44 years of priestly life, I will use a part of the Gospel of cycle "A" John 4:5-42 where Jesus arrives at a town in Samaria called Sychar where Jacob's well is located and where the Samaritans went to draw water to drink. Jesus, tired and thirsty, approaches the well and finds a Samaritan woman drawing water from the well. Jesus asks her to drink, but the woman replies, "How do you, being a Jew, ask me to drink because I am a Samaritan?" (Jews didn't get along with the Samaritans.) Jesus says to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you to drink, you would ask Him, and He would give you living water." Water that will not give you more thirst and lead you to eternal life. This is also the invitation that Jesus is making to these candidates who will give their first "yes" to Him on this day. It is also the "yes" in the dedication of the 44 years of priestly ministry that Father José Luis Soto is celebrating today. From my young years in the small semblance seen in a video I have been able to carry out pastoral ministry in different places of the world and in different languages and cultures, always in the realization of the mission that Jesus, who chose Peter, the apostles, to the saints and to so many Popes, Bishops and Priests who have continued and will continue to exercise presbyterial ministry today. Let this be an occasion to ask you to help me to thank God for this beautiful and sacred vocation in which all the priests who work in this Parish of St. Joseph participate as bridges between God and people, administering the sacraments of healing to the sick, the forgiveness of sins, baptisms, marital unions, sacramental blessings, and the celebration of the Eucharist that transforms the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus for nourishment. What a beautiful gift God the Father has left to His Church and to our families - His Son, Jesus!

This evening let us ask the Lord of the harvest to choose from among these young people his future priests and nuns who want to continue the saving mission of Jesus in His Church. May families know how to provide their children with a proper Christian environment where the Lord chooses the future vocations of His Church. May Mary Queen of the Apostles accompany us on this journey of holiness and help her Son to choose saints and good vocations!

## Sharing the Gospel

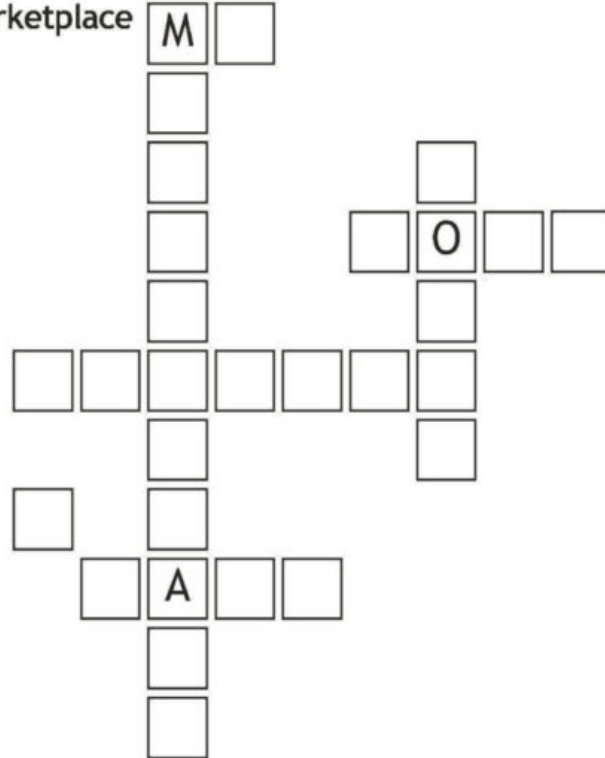

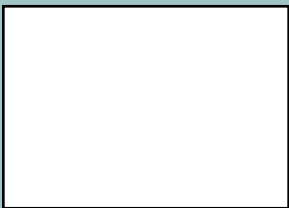
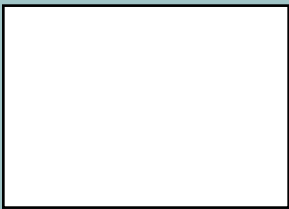
