## Cuarto domingo de Cuaresma y Segundo escrutinio



Especialmente en las Misas de 12:00 p.m. y de 1:30 p.m., en nuestra iglesia principal estamos viviendo con alegría, la conversión al catolicismo de un grupo de diez hombres y mujeres. Son los catecúmenos que participan en los tres escrutinios que se llevan a cabo el tercer, cuarto y quinto domingo de cuaresma; y que recibirán los sacramentos de iniciación en la próxima Vigilia Pascual.

Las lecturas de los evangelios de estos tres domingos nos ayudan a todos y especialmente a los recién convertidos a entender la misericordia, la humildad, la obediencia y sobre todo el poder de Dios Padre y Jesús, el Hijo que se pone al servicio de los más necesitados.

En esta ocasión, la purificación en el piscina de Siloé devuelve la vista a un ciego de nacimiento que puede ver a Jesús y puede declarar "Creo, Señor". Los catecúmenos pueden apropiarse del papel del ciego y también hacer su declaración. La Vigilia Pascual es una noche de Luz y de una nueva existencia que ellos podrán experimentar.

Mientras en las iglesias de Europa y en otros lugares se nota la falta de jóvenes y niños en los bancos de los templos, nosotros estamos agradecidos que el evangelio llega a los oídos y a los corazones de muchos que acuden a nuestros programas, se catequizan y se convierten. Este año recibirán sus sacramentos 1,568 adultos en toda la arquidiócesis de Newark, convirtiéndose este, en el año de la década donde el mayor número de fieles adultos completan sus sacramentos de iniciación.

Jesús quiso abrir los ojos de la gente de su pueblo, el hombre que no veía, pudo ver a Jesús El Señor. La fe fue su nueva visión. Creer es ver. Este creyente ahora es otro, tan otro que nadie lo reconoce. Su testimonio: "Solo sé que antes era ciego y ahora veo", lo deja marcado como uno de los discípulos de Jesús.

Creer en Jesús nos ayuda a habitar en el país de la Luz y de la Vida. La clave de la nueva visión para nosotros es que a Dios solamente lo podemos ver a través de los demás. No se puede ver a Dios y no ver a nuestros hermanos.

Algo maravilloso está sucediendo en nuestra iglesia. En un momento en que tantas personas en el mundo están negativas acerca de la fe y la Iglesia, el Espíritu Santo ha tocado los corazones de estas personas y las ha llamado a abrazar la nueva vida que Jesús les ofrece.

## IV Sunday of Lent and Second Scrutiny



At the 12:00 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. Masses, in our main church, we are joyfully experiencing the conversion to Catholicism of a group of ten men and women. They are the catechumens who will participate in the three Scrutinies that will take place on the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent; and will receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the next Easter Vigil.

The readings of the Gospels of these three Sundays help us all and especially the recently converted to understand mercy, humility, obedience and above all the power of God the Father and Jesus, the Son who places himself at the service of the most people in need.

On this occasion, the purification in the pool of Siloam restores sight to a man blind from birth who can see Jesus and can declare "I believe, Lord." The catechumens can appropriate the role of the blind man and also make his declaration. The Easter Vigil is a night of Light and a new existence that they will be able to experience.

While in the churches of Europe and in other places the lack of young people and children in the pews of the temples is noticeable, we are grateful that the gospel reaches the ears and hearts of many who come to our programs, are catechized and converted. This year, 1,568 adults throughout the Archdiocese of Newark will receive their sacraments, making this the year of the decade in which the greatest number of faithful adults complete their Sacraments of Initiation.

Jesus wanted to open the eyes of the people of his town, the man he could not see was able to see Jesus the Lord. Faith was his new vision. Believing is seeing. This believer is now another, so other that no one recognizes him. His testimony: "I only know that before I was blind and now I see," marks him as one of Jesus' followers.

Believing in Jesus helps us live in the country of Light and Life. The key to the new vision for us is that we can only see God through others. You cannot see God and not see our brothers.

Something wonderful is happening in our church. At a time when so many people in the world are negative about faith and the Church, the Holy Spirit has touched the hearts of these people and called them to embrace the new life that Jesus offers them.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### Differences Between Priest & Brothers

#### Question:

What's the difference between priests and brothers, friars, etc.?

#### Answer:

The distinctions titles and categories used for priests and the male members of religious communities can be confusing, especially since the categories can sometimes be intertwined as a man can be both a priest and a monk, or a brother and a friar. So, to help to piece the puzzle together, it's important to begin by noting some basic distinctions:

The distinction between priests (who are ordained for sacramental ministry) and brothers (who are non-ordained members of religious communities and who are committed to lives of prayer and service).

**Priests:** A priest is a man who has been ordained for sacramental ministry and these fall into two categories: A) Diocesan (or Secular) Priests can either be attached to a diocese and who serve under a bishop. Their ministry is usually oriented toward pastoral service. B) Religious Priests are members of religious communities (like the Franciscans, Jesuits, Salvatorians, or Carmelites) and their lives are guided by the special mission and charism of their community. While both kinds of priest practice sacramental ministry, their spirituality and how they live out their priesthood can be very different.

**Brothers:** Brothers are non-ordained members of religious communities (such as those mentioned above) who live lives committed to prayer and service. Religious priests and brothers serve together in their communities and their ministries include much more than the care of parishes.

**Monks, Friars, and Canons:** These are broad categories that include religious priests and brothers, and each of these is connected to specific ways of life and spiritualities. -©LPI

## A Franciscan Mystery Play



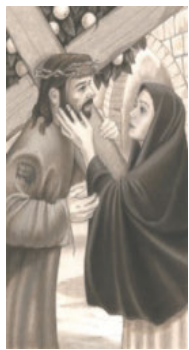
