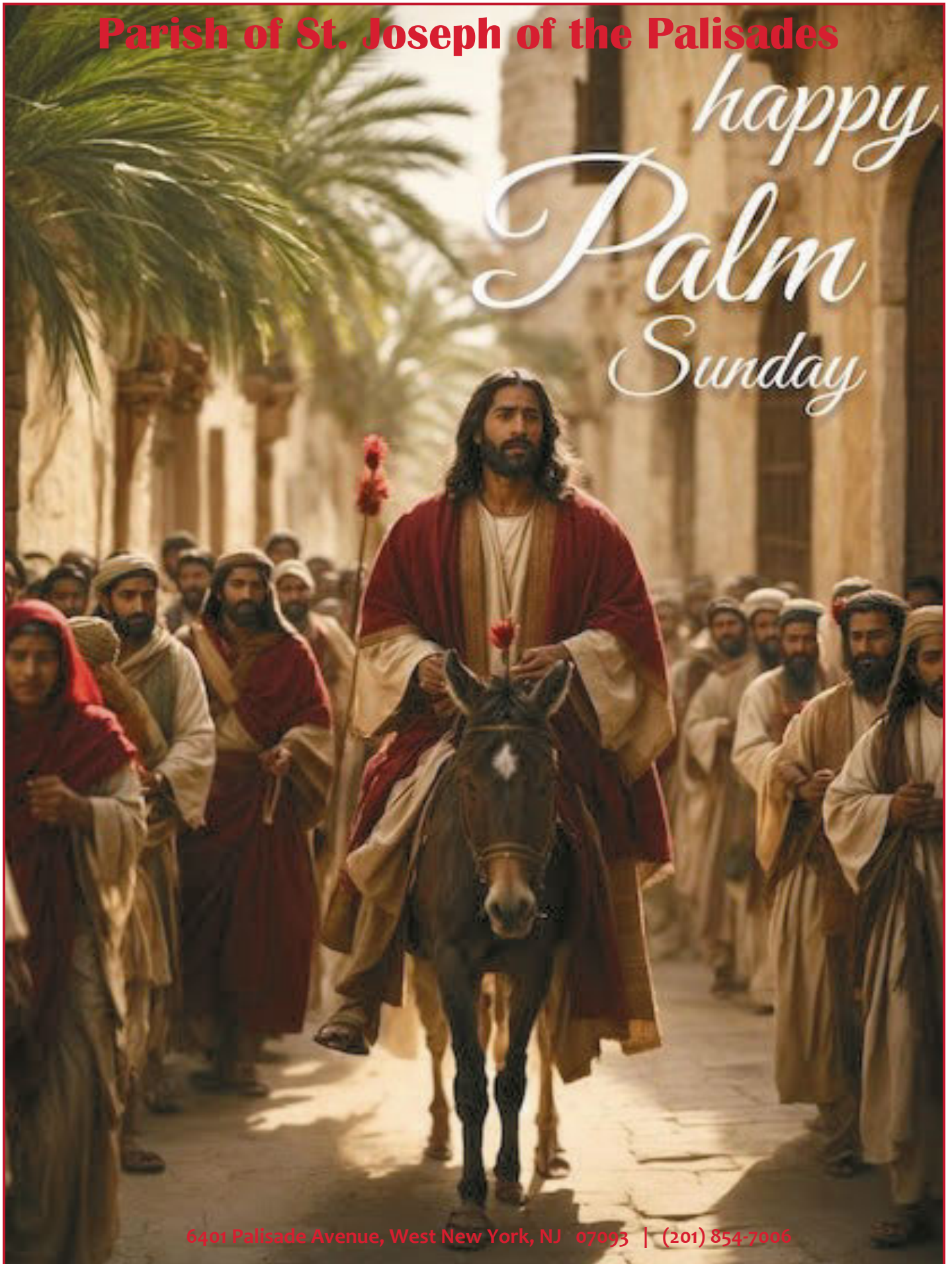

Domingo de Ramos

Hace sólo unos meses celebramos la noche del nacimiento de Jesús, el Hijo de Dios que se hizo parte de la humanidad. Hoy escuchamos el relato horrible de inhumanidad demostrada por casi toda la gente alrededor del Señor. Uno de sus amigos más íntimos lo traiciona, otro lo niega, la muchedumbre se vuelve contra él, los soldados lo torturan, las autoridades lo condenan, Pilato lo sentencia. En el Evangelio de san Marcos, aun los dos crucificados junto a él, abusan de él. La avaricia, el miedo, la cobardía, el odio y la crueldad parecen triunfar por encima de todas las virtudes que Jesús personificó. Jesús no pudo eliminar la inhumanidad de la tierra; pero nos dio un modelo de cómo oponernos a ella, sobrevivirla y vencerla. Hoy, el que se nos revela como verdaderamente el Hijo de Dios, que se mantuvo fiel y obediente a la voluntad del Padre, le demuestra a la humanidad cómo ser verdaderamente humano.

Cuando le preguntaron a Jesús cuál era el mayor de los mandamientos su respuesta fue el amor a Dios y el amor al prójimo como a sí mismo. Toda la ley y las enseñanzas de los profetas pueden ser resumidas en este mandamiento: amar. Por amor a Dios y amor al prójimo Jesús nació en este mundo, hizo su misión y murió en la cruz. A pesar del horror de ser clavado en una cruz y dejado ahí a morir, Jesús lo aceptó todo por amor al Padre y por amor a quienes él había sido enviado a salvar. A través de su muerte nos enseñó la profundidad de su amor y el valor de ese amor.

Jesús hace una declaración audaz acerca de la mujer que lo unge con perfume sólo unos días antes de que lo mataran: “En cualquier parte del mundo donde se predique el Evangelio, se recordará también en su honor lo que ella ha hecho conmigo” (*Marcos 14, 9*). Solamente ella hace algo amoroso y misericordioso por él unos días antes de enfrentar él su muerte. Algunos se mofan de ella, considerando su acción como un desperdicio de perfume caro. Dicen que valía casi un año de salario, una suma enorme que pudiera habersele entregado a los pobres. Tal vez tuvieran razón. Tal vez lo que ella hizo fue extravagante. Pero Jesús nos enseña que tal extravagancia hacia las personas que amamos no es ningún desperdicio. Después de todo, si fuéramos a mirar la vida del Mesías, que no terminó como el que curó todas las enfermedades, el benefactor de todos los mendigos y el vencedor de todos sus adversarios, sino en una cruz y condenado como un criminal, tal vez viéramos su vida como un desperdicio. ¿Cuál sería la intención de Dios al enviar a Jesús al mundo sólo para morir como un criminal condenado y en un mundo que, objetivamente, no era mejor que antes? Con los ojos de la fe sabemos que su vida no fue un desperdicio, pues él nos curó nuestro espíritu, pagó por nuestros pecados y consiguió la victoria sobre la muerte. Así como esta mujer se rebajó al entrar en la casa de un leproso y usó todo el perfume que había en su frasco, Jesús se rebajó para entrar en una humanidad pecaminosa y usó toda su vida para darnos el don incalculable de la vida eterna. Éste es el Evangelio proclamado.

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Just a few months ago we celebrated the night of the birth of Jesus, the Son of God who became part of humanity. Today we hear the horrific account of inhumanity demonstrated by almost all the people around the Lord. One of his closest friends betrays him, another denies him, the crowd turns against him, the soldiers torture him, the authorities condemn him, Pilate sentences him. In the Gospel of St. Mark, even the two crucified next to him abused him. Greed, fear, cowardice, hatred and cruelty seem to triumph for over all the virtues that Jesus personified. Jesus could not eliminate inhumanity from the earth; but he gave us a model of how to oppose it, survive it, and overcome it. Today, the one who is revealed to us as truly the Son of God, who remained faithful and obedient to the will of the Father, shows humanity how to be truly human.

When Jesus was asked what the greatest of the commandments was, his answer was love of God and love of neighbor as oneself. The whole law and the teachings of the prophets can be summed up in this commandment: love. Out of love for God and love for neighbor, Jesus was born into this world, did his mission, and died on the cross. Despite the horror of being nailed to a cross and left to die, Jesus accepted everything out of love for the Father and out of love for those he had been sent to save. Through his death he taught us the depth of his love and the value of that love. Jesus makes a bold statement about the woman who anoints him with perfume just a few days before he was killed: "In any part of the world where the Gospel is preached, what she has done to me will also be remembered in her honor" (Mark 14:9). Only she does something loving and merciful for him a few days before he faces his death. Some scoff at her, regarding her action as a waste of expensive perfume. They say it was worth nearly a year's salary, an enormous sum that could have been given to the poor. Maybe they were right. Maybe what she did was outlandish. But Jesus teaches us that such extravagance toward the people we love is no waste. After all, if we were to look at the life of the Messiah, who ended not as the one who cured all diseases, the benefactor of all beggars and the victor of all his adversaries, but on a cross and condemned as a criminal, we might see his life as a waste. What would be God's intention in sending Jesus into the world only to die as a convicted criminal and in a world that, objectively, was no better than before? With the eyes of faith we know that his life was not wasted, for he healed our spirits, paid for our sins, and won victory over death. Just as this woman stooped to enter a leper's house and used all the perfume in her bottle, Jesus stooped to enter into sinful humanity and used his entire life to give us the priceless gift of eternal life. This is the Gospel proclaimed.

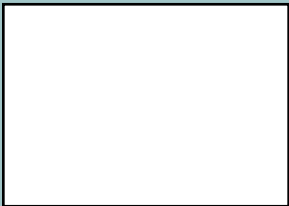
