Queridos hermanos y hermanas,

Este es un pasaje bíblico muy fuerte, pero es en lo que muchos hemos estado meditando durante la cuaresma: la sombra de la muerte.

Sentimos el aguijón... En la impotencia del dolor frente a la enfermedad. En la sala de urgencias hospitalarias. En las calles devastadas por la droga, el robo y la guerra entre países hermanos.

Y también al ver como la tormenta, las inundaciones y los incendios forestales arrebatan todo a los inocentes.

Las sombras de la muerte (tristeza, miedo, ira, desesperación, racismo, odio, persecución política, religiosa y laboral) oscurecen nuestros días.

¿Cómo podemos cantar "Aleluya" cuando la muerte está tan cerca para nosotros como en tu teléfono y la televisión?

En la mañana de Pascua, miraré hacia el este. El sol saldrá, hará retroceder las sombras y derramará su cálida luz sobre la tierra.

Las sombras de la Pasión en viernes Santo no puede opacar la Luz que irradia del amor que Jesús nos tiene. El amor es cómo la esperanza, se eleva como el sol. El amor alivia el aguijón de la muerte. El amor es la luz espiritual que no se puede apagar, que tiene el poder de salvarnos al final de nuestro caminar.

¡Cristo ha resucitado! El amor nunca termina, ni en Semana Santa y en las noches más largas y oscuras. La experiencia de la resurrección es la victoria de Jesús sobre la muerte. Es el recuerdo constante en nuestro corazón de que nuestra meta esta en Cielo. Envidias, resentimiento e indiferencia se quedan en el Sepulcro y los que allí quieran estar.

Querida familia de San José, el Señor ha cruzado los umbrales de la muerte e invito a todos ustedes, ¡queridos feligreses que vivamos con gozo la alegría de la Pascua!

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

This is a very strong biblical passage, but it is what many of us have been meditating on during Lent: the shadow of death.

We feel the sting...in the impotence of pain. In the face of disease. In the hospital emergency room. In the streets devastated by drugs, robbery and war between brotherly countries.

And also seeing how the storm, floods and wildfires take everything away from the innocent. The shadows of death (sadness, fear, anger, despair, racism, hatred, political, religious and labor persecution) darken our days.

How can we sing "Hallelujah" when death is as close to us as it is on your phone and TV?

On Easter morning, I'll look east. The sun will rise, push back the shadows, and shed its warm light upon the earth.

The shadows of the Passion on Good Friday cannot obscure the Light that radiates from the love that Jesus has for us. Love is like hope, it rises like the sun. Love soothes the sting of death. Love is the spiritual light that cannot be extinguished, that has the power to save us at the end of our journey.

Christ is risen! Love never ends, not at Easter or in the longest, darkest nights.

The experience of the resurrection is Jesus' victory over death. It is the constant reminder in our hearts that our goal is in Heaven. Envy, resentment and indifference remain in the Sepulchre and those who want to be there.

Dear family of St. Joseph, the Lord has crossed the threshold of death and I invite all of you, dear parishioners, to live with jubilation the joy of Easter!

Hallelujah!

What Would Mary Do?

This Easter morning, I am thinking of Mary Magdalene.

I want to know her state of mind as she approached the tomb in the darkness. Was she afraid? Was she thinking clearly? Was she tired? Had grief and trauma robbed her of her sleep the last two nights? What did she intend to do? Anoint Christ's body, yes — but what else? Kiss his hands, trace the markings where the lash had fallen upon his skin? Say goodbye? Weep? Despair?

What were the words she planned to whisper into the cold, empty darkness that morning, as she wept over God's body?

I don't know anything about her state of mind that Easter morning, except that I know she wanted to be with Christ. Perhaps that was all she knew, too. Perhaps she had no other thought, no other desire, than nearness to him. She didn't need to understand everything, and she didn't expect answers — she didn't dare hope for that.

But everything and everyone had fallen apart around her, and in Jesus' presence she knew her heart would be able to rest.

If you have ever been in the midst of a crisis in your life and found yourself pacing the floors of your house when no one else is awake, muttering the words to a prayer you know by heart, you know what Mary Magdalene felt. In those moments, we do not always feel God's presence. Sometimes, when we look for Him, we only see an empty tomb.

When these dark moments come, I pray you will remember the faithfulness of this great saint. Be like Mary Magdalene. Look for Jesus, always. You may not always find him, but he will always find you.

"She ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, 'They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him.'"


