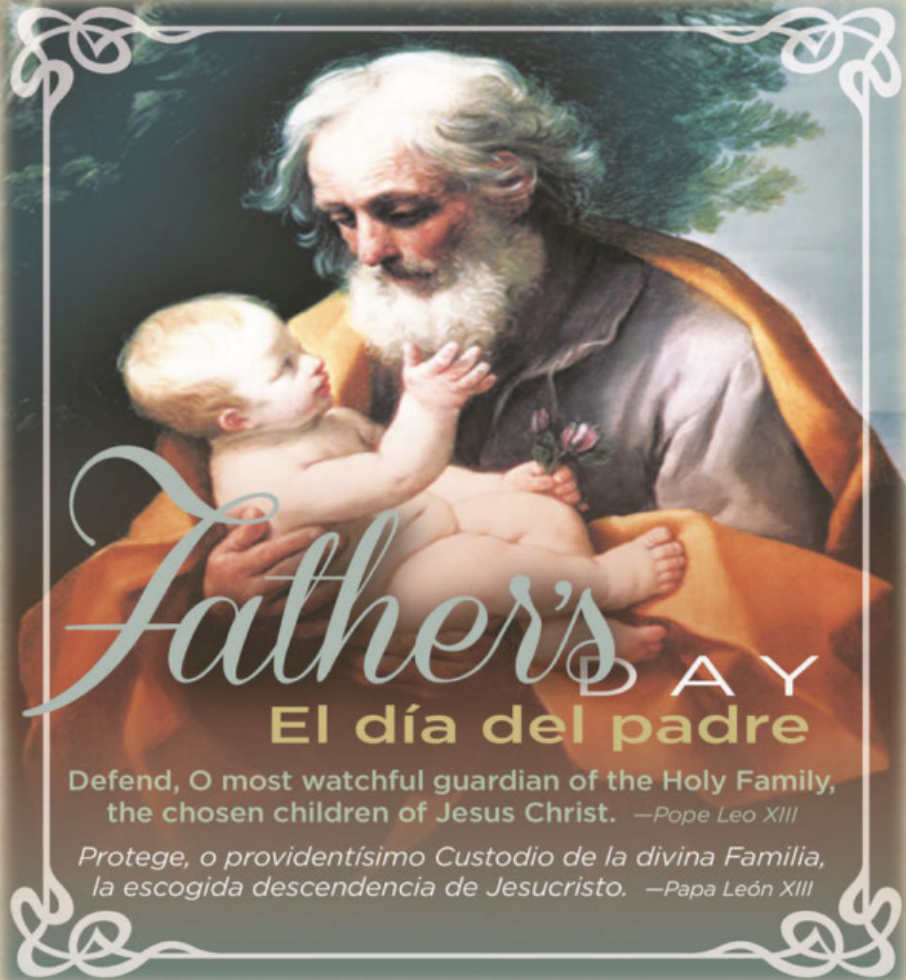

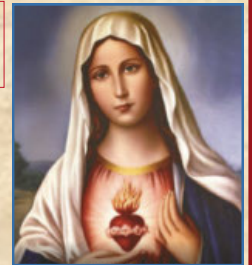

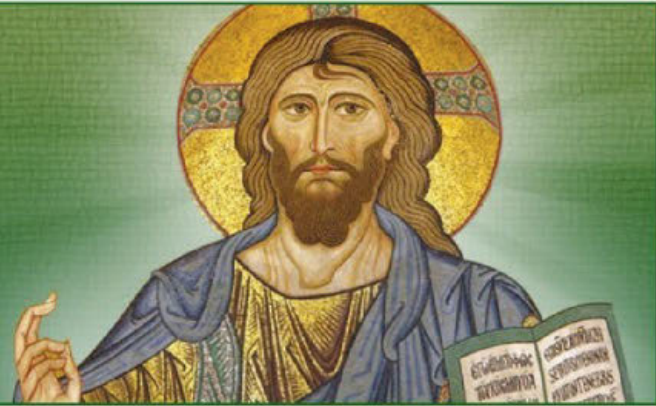

## 11 Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Las lecturas de hoy son especialmente oportunas en este momento del año. Dos de los pasajes están relacionados con la naturaleza, específicamente con el crecimiento de árboles y plantas grandes. Por estar ya entrando en el verano, podemos apreciar la sombra que ofrece un árbol espeso y frondoso. En este Día del Padre, un árbol robusto que nos cobija y nos consuela puede recordarnos a nuestro propio padre o a otros padres que conocemos. Al igual que los árboles y las plantas durante el verano, al igual que los padres que nos aman y nos cuidan, las semillas que sembramos y atendemos crecen lenta e incesantemente, produciendo frutos que construyen el Reino de Dios en medio de nosotros.

Debido a que los objetos de estas parábolas del Evangelio de hoy —semillas, plantas, frutos, cosechas— eran cosas con las que la gente en el tiempo de Jesús podían relacionarse, les era posible captar el significado obvio.

En cada estación de cultivo, ellos veían el fruto de la tierra. Con el paso del tiempo, ellos vieron cómo la pequeñísima semilla de mostaza se convirtió en un inmenso arbusto. Esos relatos, en forma de cuentos, resultaban memorables. Y como se relacionaban con sus actividades cotidianas los podrían recordar frecuentemente. Por tanto, al pasar del tiempo, ellos podían continuar reflexionando sobre su significado, tal como hacemos nosotros con el pasaje de un libro que queremos resaltar y guardar.

Marcos no nos dice cómo Jesús explicó estas parábolas a sus discípulos, aunque alguna vez oímos a Jesús interpretar otras de ellas. ¿Cómo interpretaría Jesús estas dos parábolas? Él presenta ambas como maneras de entender el Reino de Dios. Podemos concluir que el Reino de Dios es algo que sigue creciendo, algo que crece imperceptiblemente, pero que crece magníficamente. El fruto de este crecimiento puede ser disfrutado por otros: el grano para quienes lo comen, la sombra para los pájaros que se anidan, el Reino para quienes lo alcanzan.

Con el transcurso del tiempo, todas estas características emergen de una pequeñísima semilla escondida en un terreno fértil.

Antes de que las semillas de las dos parábolas de Jesús crezcan y se conviertan en alimento o buena sombra, deben germinar y recibir los nutrientes de la tierra, deben echar raíces profundas en el terreno y por fin emerger en forma de retoño. Nosotros no vemos nada de esto, pues ocurre en el subterráneo —un misterio invisible para nuestros ojos. He aquí otra manera que esto se compara con el Reino de Dios. Tal como dice Pablo en la Segunda lectura: “Caminamos guiado por la fe, sin ver todavía (2 Corintios 5, 7). No siempre podemos ver cómo nuestras obras ayudan a construir el Reino de Dios. No podemos ver el destino de nuestra peregrinación hacia el Reino.

Pero ponemos nuestra confianza en Jesús, con la certeza de que él nos mostrará el camino. Confiamos en que floreceremos y daremos fruto al igual que sucede con la vida que existe dentro de una semilla.

## 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings are especially timely at this time of year. Two of the passages are related to nature, specifically to the growth of trees and large plants. As we are already entering summer, we can appreciate

the shade offered by a thick and leafy tree. On this Father's Day, a sturdy tree that shelters and comforts us can remind us of our own father or other fathers we know. Like trees and plants during the summer, like parents who love and care for us, the seeds we sow and care for grow slowly and incessantly, producing fruits that build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Because the objects of these parables in today's Gospel—seeds, plants, fruits, harvests—were things that people in Jesus' day could relate to, they were able to grasp the obvious meaning.

In each growing season, they saw the fruit of the earth. Over time, they saw how the tiny mustard seed became a huge bush. These stories, in the form of stories, were memorable. And because they related to their daily activities, they could remember them frequently. Therefore, as time went by, they could continue to reflect on its meaning, just as we do with the passage from a book that we want to highlight and keep. Mark does not tell us how Jesus explained these parables to his disciples, although we do hear Jesus interpret others from time to time. How would Jesus interpret these two parables? He presents both as ways of understanding the Kingdom of God. We can conclude that the Kingdom of God is something that continues to grow, something that grows imperceptibly, but that grows magnificently. The fruit of this growth may be enjoyed by others: the grain for those who eat it, the shade for the nesting birds, the Kingdom for those who reach it.

Over time, all these characteristics emerge from a tiny seed hidden in fertile soil.

Before the seeds of Jesus' two parables grow into food or good shade, they must germinate and receive nutrients from the earth, they must take deep roots in the ground, and finally emerge as a shoot. We see none of this, for it occurs underground—a mystery invisible to our eyes. Here's another way this compares to the Kingdom of God. As Paul says in the Second Reading: "We walk guided by faith, not yet seeing" (2 Corinthians 5:7). We can't always see how our works help build the Kingdom of God. We cannot see the fate of our pilgrimage to the Kingdom.

But we put our trust in Jesus, with the certainty that he will show us the way. We trust that we will flourish and bear fruit just as life exists within a seed.

Question of the Week:

How do I walk in faith, thus demonstrating my trust in God, even with things I cannot see? (Fr. Fernando Diaz)

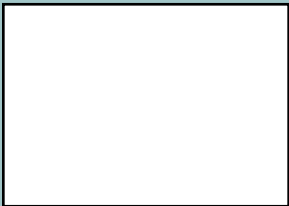
